Norway Leaders in Medicine

February marks the anniversary of the death of a notable Norwegian physician, Gerhard Henrik Armauer Hansen (7/29/1841 – 2/12/1912). He lived in Oslo and was known for isolating the cause of the biblical scourge, leprosy, as a bacterium in 1873. Before that time, it was thought to be hereditary or a noxious air. Although his life was filled with controversy, the discovery of leprosy as a disease was attributed to him and it is now even referred to as “Hansen’s Disease”. A Bergen, Norway trip may warrant a visit to the leprosy museum in his honor.
