




## Author Kathleen Ernst speaks on Ladies Day

## The Cost of Absent Reservations

On January 21, the Chicago Torske Klub board met for a meeting and a few decisions. Although we remain healthy and viable with finances stable and membership well over 100, we see some trends that have caused us to change the rules for meal reservations.

As you are aware, we must collect reservations by Monday, for the Elks Club to order fish. We pay for what we order by agreement

with the Elks. It is fair.

There has always been a policy to forgive the cost of a reservation "no-show".

There is usually a good reason for absence; illness of member or spouse, funerals, etc. It has been our practice to handle the absences and bear the cost of the meal.

Absentees are 5-10% of the reservations in the past.

We have recently seen that absentee count rise. As that cost goes up, our small reserve is depleted to pay for reserved absences, but this cannot continue. At this time, we have decided to just reduce our reservations by 5%, but that means a few things:

- Late reservations will be less likely to get a fish dinner. We may periodically ask for volunteers to take a non-fish dinner.
- Rather than offer the extra meals to the raffle table (sometimes a less desirable prize), the boss will offer the meals to willing recipients.
- We ask every member to be a good steward of their reservation. IF you reserve Monday and expect to not attend, a call or email to the secretary before Saturday is requested and expected.
