## Per Lysne's Legacy

If you haven't made the pilgrimage to the Vesterheim Norwegian-American Museum, it is worth the time. Kathy and I finally allocated a couple days last week and made the trip. The terrain around Decorah, Iowa looks more like the hill and valley terrain of southern Norway, than what one would expect from Iowa. No wonder the Norsk immigrants found that as home. After a delightful stay at the Hotel Winneshiek down the street, we spent a few hours traversing the memories and discoveries of our ancestral history.



One section lured me: the Per Lysne folk art; highlighting his rosemaling. I grew up with Per Lysne, in a sense. His painted plate always had a place of honor in our house for all my memory. He was a neighbor of my grandmother and great aunt on Main Street in Stoughton, Wisconsin; painting plates and furniture until his death in the 1940s, after a career as a wagon painter. My mother had purchased one at the time. It was one of those simple artifacts whose simple symmetry and design of his own childhood memory influenced a new generation of rose painting. I bet he would be surprised at the influence he had.
