### Viking Swords at Father, Son, Daughter Day

Our featured speaker this month is Richard Furrer from Door County Forgeworks. He is the blacksmith featured on PBS show Nova - Secrets of the Viking Sword showing the making of Ulfberht sword. He is based outside of Sturgeon Bay, Wisconsin and will be joining us with his insights. If you have not seen this show, the abstract notes:

"The Vikings were some of the fiercest warriors of all time, and a select few carried the ultimate weapon, a sword nearly 1,000 years ahead of its time, built by a mysterious craftsman, from a material unknown to rivals for centuries. The sword was known as the 'Ulfberht.' "
