Who are you made of?

In the last 20 years as DNA analysis has matured, the borders and ethnic differences between countries have been illuminated. Many folks have claimed ancestry in one country or more as it was defined by their parents


and grandparents. Many of us define ourselves as Norwegians, Swedes, Danes, Irish, Swiss, etc., but if the DNA test is taken, they report a blend of many other nationalities. Their immediate belief may be that something is wrong, but actually, the blend is more typical than not.

Scandinavian DNA is most commonly found in Norway, Sweden and Denmark, but it is also found in Great Britain, Ireland, Finland, France, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Baltic States (Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania). Conversely, Scandinavians my find these traits, as well as Portuguese, Sicilian, Polish and Ukrainian.

We tend to think of our ancestors as immutable, local home-bodies. Perhaps they were so in the last few hundred years but history shows many were not. Many were quite mobile. Certainly somebody in your family decided to come to America in the last 500 years to find better opportunity, and so did others
