Sweater Day History

We have committed to wearing sweaters for this January luncheon in the last decade, and the style most of us favor is the traditional Norwegian sweater with traditional design.

It may surprise you to learn that these sweaters are not some ancient Viking tradition handed down through the generations. In fact, most Norwegian origins of knitting gloves and hats are derived from mainland Europe in the 1600s, and knitting sweaters not popular until the 1800s. The Dale of Norway sweater company was not founded until 1872 when Peder Jebsen selected the small town of Dale outside of Bergen to set up textile manufacturing. This coincided with the two colored sweater designs of Setesdal and Fana, so sweaters became more widespread across the nation. The sweaters were popularized abroad as travelers to Norway brought souvenirs in the early 20th century. Ugly Christmas sweaters came later.
